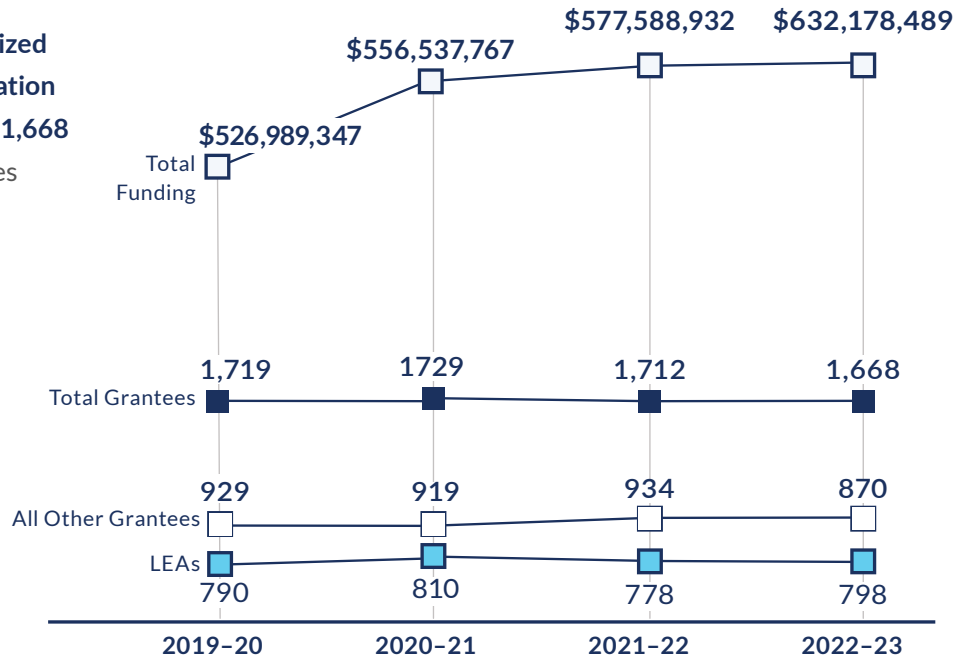




The Department of Education supports many adult education programs.

The Adult Education program authorized under Title II of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funded 1,668 providers throughout the United States during program year 2022-23.¹

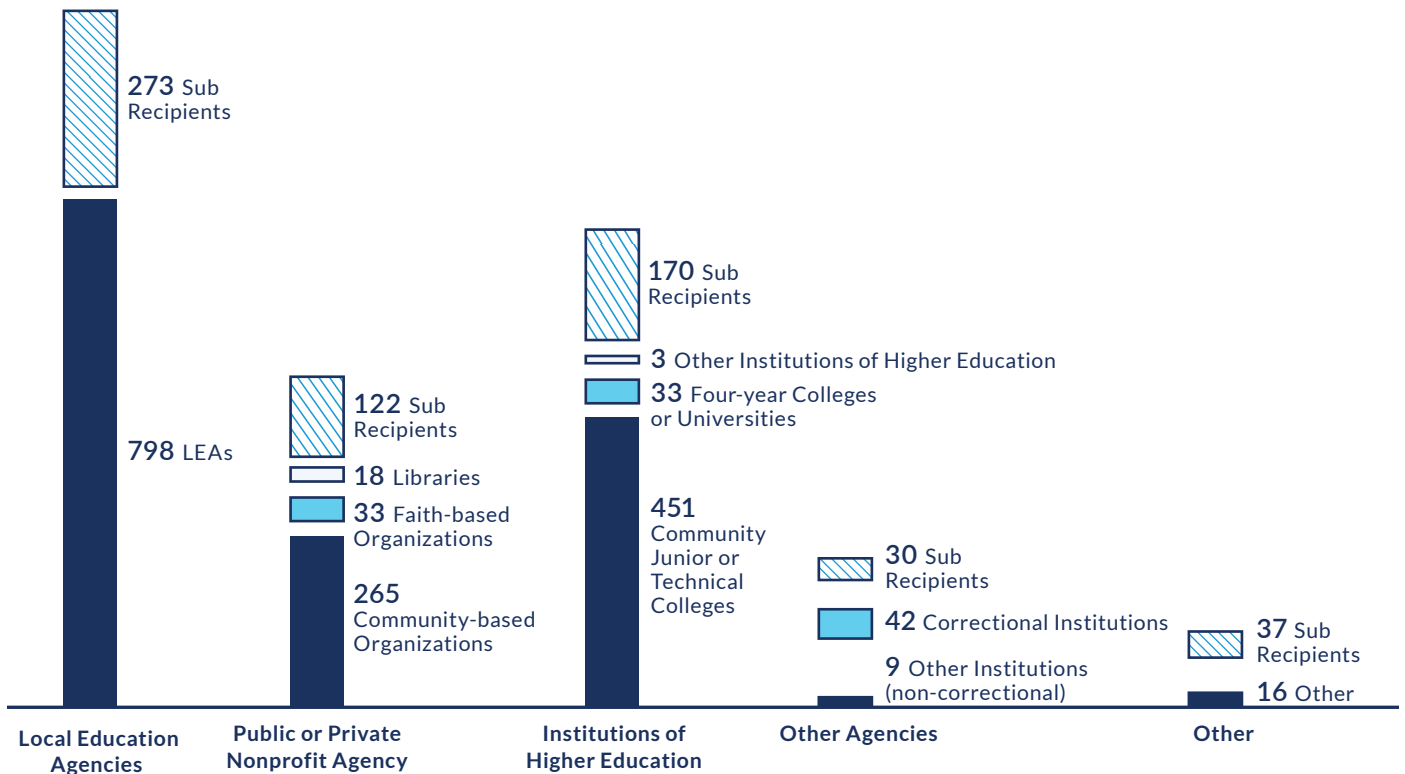
The most common types of adult education grantees are local education agencies (LEAs) (e.g., school districts). A little less than half of all adult education grantees funded under Title II of WIOA are LEAs.



Agencies that receive funding for adult education are diverse.

In addition to local education agencies, other grant recipients include public and private nonprofit agencies, institutions of higher education, and more. These grantees also fund additional subrecipients.

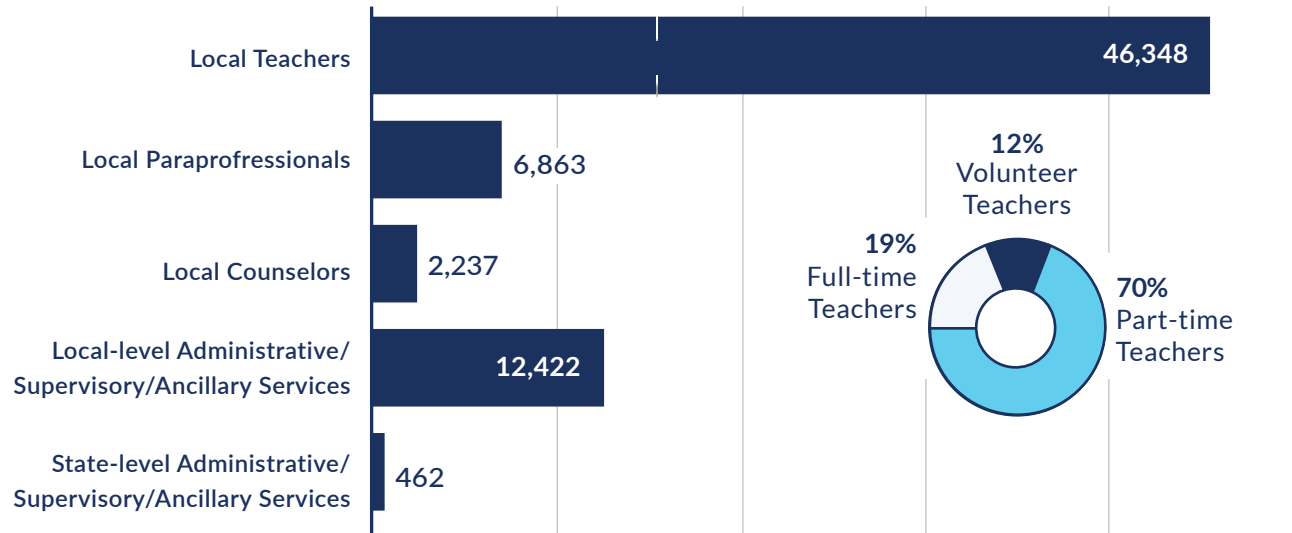
In program year 2022-23:



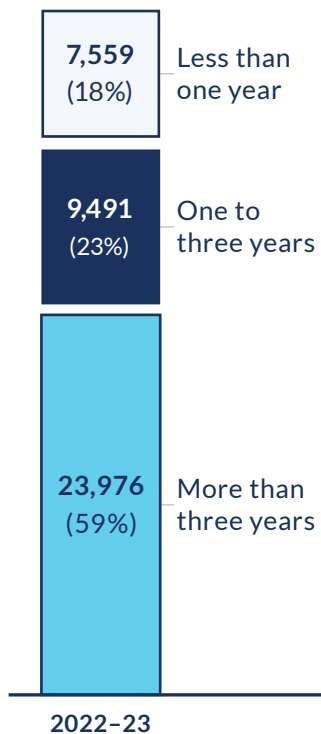
Many people working in diverse capacities are needed to make adult education possible.

Teachers represent the largest category of personnel in adult education programs, comprising 68% of the paid and volunteer adult education workforce. Among teachers, most (70%)² are employed part-time.

In program year 2022-23:

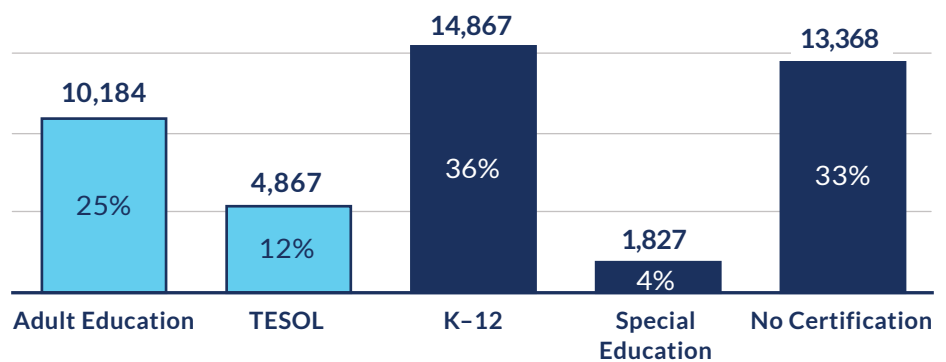


Most full- and part-time teachers are experienced.



Most full- and part-time teachers, 77%, hold an education certification. About 25% of teachers hold an adult education certification and 12% hold a TESOL certification. Other certifications are not specifically related to adult education or English language acquisition, and teachers may hold more than one certificate.
