




Agencies that receive funding for adult education are diverse.

In addition to local education agencies, other grant recipients include public and private nonprofit agencies, institutions of higher education, and more. These grantees also fund additional subrecipients.




Many people working in diverse capacities are needed to make adult education possible.

Teachers represent the largest category of personnel in adult education programs, comprising 70% of the adult education workforce. Most teachers, 67%, are employed part-time. Only 20% of teachers are employed full-time and 13% are volunteers.
